Felix Burns, born in Perth, Scotland, was a prolific composer of popular music. His busy life included teaching music, and serving his local church as choir director and organist; not to mention his 13 children, of whom nine survived to adulthood, with his wife, Catherine.

His 16 dance albums included popular folk dances; Haymakers is included in the Vanity Fair, Dickens, Flag of Empire, Gaiety, Imperial, London Town, Merry Makers, Old Drury, Royal Standard, Vaudeville and Frivolity dance albums.

Felix Burns composed for musicians of all abilities, giving the opportunity for players of different levels to get together, make music and bring joy to others.
